IVAN YATES, GUEST SPEAKER



Ivan Yates is a well-known broadcaster, commentator and a former politician. He was elected as a Fine Gael Deputy for Wexford at the 1981 general election. Aged 21 years and 8 months, Yates was the youngest member of the 22nd Dáil. He served on Fine Gael's Front Bench and was appointed Minister for Agriculture, Food and Forestry in the Rainbow Government between 1994 and 1997. He retired from politics in 2002.

Ivan Yates subsequently set up Celtic Bookmakers which rapidly expanded but went into receivership in January 2011. He subsequently took up a broadcasting career and currently co-presents the Newstalk Breakfast programme with Chris Donoghue. His autobiography entitled "Full On" will be published later this year.
